John 21.1-19 is a reading for April 10th.

“After these things Jesus showed himself again to the disciples by the Sea of Tiberias; Simon Peter said to them, ‘I am going fishing.’ They said to him, ‘We will go with you.’ They went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing.

Just after daybreak, Jesus stood on the beach; but the disciples did not know that it was Jesus. Jesus said to them, ‘Children, you have no fish, have you?’ They answered him, ‘No.’ He said to them, ‘Cast the net to the right side of the boat, and you will find some.’ So they cast it, and now they were not able to haul it in because there were so many fish.”

Murmurings from the Manse

“Of course I trust in God”, I said, with equal amounts of incredulity and indignation, stung by the very idea I would do otherwise.

The person who asked me that question has long since died, but over the last few months I have learnt anew what it means, that it is not enough to simply state the words, but to believe them.

From April 1st our three church pastorate becomes a two church pastorate, Malmesbury URC and Royal Wootton Bassett URC, no longer ‘North West Wiltshire’ now simply two churches who enjoy coming together when possible but who are trying to build up God’s kingdom in their communities trusting in God’s grace to bring that about; filled with the Spirit and following the example of Jesus, our Lord and Saviour.

In the post –Easter period we are acutely aware of the challenge to be *Easter People* and it is a challenge, one of many we are currently facing, but alongside the challenge we have HOPE; hope in that what we do will be blessed by God, what we do will bring glory to God, what we do is not for our own comfort and security and because it is familiar but because we believe it is what God is calling us to do at this time.

I know the coming two years will not be easy; but I have the faith and trust to know that we are not alone; God is with us in everything that we do, whatever lies ahead and with God’s blessing and encouragement we can, each one of us, achieve great things.

So we continue to pray, we continue to hope, and we continue to trust: for with God, nothing is impossible.
